The Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Program initiative is to develop and implement a system of support for CCDF License-Exempt Family, Friend, or Neighbor (LEFFN) and Licensed Family, Friend, or Neighbor (LFFN) home child care providers in meeting the CCDF program's requirements.

Training and technical assistance

Materials Distribution to Support Child Care Business Start-Up

Family child care providers receive start-up materials from the Department of Community and Cultural Affairs's Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF). These materials are given to all new license-exempt and licensed Family, Friend, and Neighbor providers to help their child care businesses. Items distributed include diapers, educational materials, and toys for children in the CCDF program.

The Business Administration Scale of BAS was introduced to family child care providers through a pilot program. The BAS is a tool used for measuring and improving the overall quality of professional and business practices in the family child care setting. In the month of May, a small group of providers participated in the assessment to help set guidelines for all family child care providers in our community.

Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale (FCCERS-3) reaches CNMI homes

The Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale, Third Edition (FCCERS-3), is an assessment tool used to evaluate the quality of family child care environments, ensuring that children in the Commonwealth are nurtured and grow in developmentally appropriate settings.

A small group of family child care providers in our community was selected to be part of the FCCERS Pilot Program and completed their observations in May 2024.
